WHAT IS FASD?

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) is a term used to describe the variety of lifelong problems that may occur for individuals who have been exposed to alcohol before birth.

FASD is a neurodevelopmental condition requiring assessment and diagnosis from a multidisciplinary team.

In Australia, it is often unrecognised. We know that people with FASD are 30 times more likely to be involved in the justice system.

FASD ASSESSMENT PATHWAY

Client meets these 5 criteria:

- Is aged between 11 to 17.5 years old (VIC) or 8 to 17.5 years old (NSW, SA, TAS, WA);
- Has interacted with youth justice and/or child protection services;
- · Has possible difficulties with physical activities, language, memory, learning and behaviour;
- Is at risk of engagement with youth justice; and
- Has clear documented evidence of prenatal alcohol exposure from either the birth mother or a reliable eyewitness.
